







Scotland's children should have access to lawyers that are experts in working with children as well as being experts in the law

- What that means in practice



Dr Claire Lightowler – Improving Legal Support for Children and Young People in Conflict with the Law

- Communicate in a range of ways which best suits each child
- Take time to build a relationship to support their understanding
- Support and empower the child
- Be trauma-informed and based on a good understanding of child development and children's rights.

It is unlawful for a public authority to act... in a way which is incompatible with UNCRC

- A public authority reporting duty
- Enhanced powers for the Children's Commissioner
